



Alex Rogers, Institute of Zoology, Zoological Society of London, London, UK

Dr Alex Rogers is a marine biologist working at London Zoo whose research focuses on the diversity, ecology, conservation and evolution of marine species. He has special interests in the deep sea, particularly seamounts, cold-water corals and chemosynthetic ecosystems. Alex has published 57 papers in peer-reviewed journals, 12 book chapters and has co-authored published one book.

He has worked on marine policy and undertaken projects for the UN International Seabed Authority, UN Division of Oceans and Law of the Sea, the IUCN and with the G8+5 Global Legislators Organisation for a Balanced Environment (GLOBE) as a Commissioner for the Commission on Land Use Change and Ecosystems.

He is also Scientific Director of the NGO the International Programme on State of the Ocean. His policy work has included recent articles in *Species*, *Yale Global*, *European Voice* and the *Independent* and he has authored or co-authored 30 reports on applied aspects of marine biology.
